The Wellness Center Coalition continues growing and will encompass an area in the northwestern region of Indiana – crossing the state line into the Indiana area – and currently looking for a site to build the 8th Wellness Center to benefit you, our Members and your families. The Wellness Center Coalition is now teaming up with the Iron Workers, Local 395 and Ron Ware, their Business Manager; together this team will provide more easily accessible healthcare to those living in or near Indiana.

The JAC Board of Trustees is proud to proclaim that Ed won 1st Place in the UA's Plumbing Division. Ed, who works for John J. Cahill, Inc., is now heading to the District Contest in June 2022. Many thanks to our JAC Instructors and our Journeymen who mentored Ed on the job. Their teamwork helped make Ed our winner!

After a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic, the 67th Annual Chicago St. Patrick's Day Parade took place in 2022 with the Parade Theme 'Honoring Chicagoland's Essential Workers'. The Parade Committee held a virtual Queen's Contest in January and virtually interviewed 51 candidates, settled on the top 20 and then narrowed the field to 5 final candidates. Parking Garage Nears Completion

The seven story parking garage located at, 1371 W. Randolph Street, is fast- approaching its completion this summer 2022. Along with its 500^+ spaces, this structure will feature 11,500 square feet of ground-level retail with 22-foot ceiling spans.

There will also be a 2,400 square foot retail-oriented terrace on the third level. Our union signage is also proudly on display on the south facing side and there will also be eco-friendly vegetated planters along the façade that receive their water through the in-house rain water harvest system.

"This parking garage will be an added benefit for Local 130 members who will be able to enjoy free parking while attending meetings or events at the Hall," said James F. Coyne, Business Manager Plumbers Local 130 UA. "This parking structure will also be rented to neighbors, locals and out-of-town visitors to the West Loop. There will also be revenue generated from the commercial spaces which is another benefit to our membership," he added.

Welfare Fund/Optum Card

Participants:

As you are aware the Plumbers' Welfare Fund transitioned to Optum Financial (Optum) as its HRA provider effective January 1, 2022. Some of our members have been in contact with the Fund Office to convey some of the problems they have been experiencing with Optum. I'd like to take this opportunity to provide you with some suggestions on how to handle any problems you may encounter with Optum going forward.

- Any time you use your Optum card make sure to *keep your receipt* in case you are requested by Optum to provide verification of an expense at any point in the future.
- Make sure you keep the *Explanation of Benefit (EOB)* form that is sent to you by the Plumbers' Welfare Fund or Delta Dental. The EOB, along with the proper receipt for the expenditure, can be uploaded to Optum through their phone application to satisfy a request for additional documentation.
- If you use your Optum card for a prescription drug co-payment, make sure you keep the *prescription's detailed* receipt that is provided to you by the pharmacy that accompanies your prescription medication. If Optum requests confirmation for a prescription drug copayment you can upload the detailed receipt to Optum through the phone application as well.
- You can enter claims on-line at <u>www.secure.optumfinancial.com</u> or using the mobile application Optum Financial. Once your account is activated follow the steps on screen to enter the required information about your claim. Continue through the screens and *upload* the requested documentation as required.
- If you have any questions about your Optum account, you can contact Optum directly at 877-292-4040.

We are pleased to announce that Plumbers Local 130 UA members did receive their wage and benefit increase on June 1, 2022. The amount of the increase depended on which signatory contractors association represents your employer (see tables below). For the plumbers, this is the third year of a four year agreement that was negotiated between Local 130 and the three associations. The journeyperson plumber's wage rate (on the check) is \$54.80 per hour if working for a PCA or WSA employer and \$50.40 if working in Kankakee/Iroquois Counties (KICPPA). We are pleased to announce that Technical Engineers did receive their wage and benefit increase on June 1, 2022. The Journeyperson's rate for those members working in Illinois has increased to \$53.00 per hour. For the Technical Engineers who work in Indiana, this is the third year of a five vear agreement with Northwest Indiana Contractors Association (NWICA) which began on June 1, 2022.
